



EDUCATION FOR LIFE POLICY

The County High School, Leftwich actively promotes students' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development (SMSC). The Academy's work and improvement planning will support and promote the four outcomes:

- Spiritual development
- Moral development
- Social development
- Cultural development

Curriculum

In addition to the whole curriculum supporting the SMSC outcomes, SMSC will be explicitly developed through the delivery to all students of an age adjusted EFL curriculum. That curriculum will be designed and led by the EFL faculty leadership, under guidance from SLT, working closely with LLs(Year) and will as far as possible be delivered by each child's learning mentor/tutor, drawing on outside expertise as appropriate.

The EFL curriculum's composition supports our obligation to foster well-informed attitudes, promotes tolerance and works to deter the cultivation of extremist views among our students.

Policies

All of the policies of CHSL promote the SMSC outcomes (see annotated School's Policy Register) and so could be subsumed under the EFL policy. For purposes of clarity, the present document will explicitly include, under the outcomes Be Healthy and Stay safe, policies on Health Education, Sex Education, Drugs and Smoke Free. Under the outcomes Enjoy and Achieve and Achieve Economic Well-being, will be considered independent Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG).

Health Education

CHSL will promote Health Education through the curriculum, notably through EFL, D&T, Science and PE; through working closely with the School Nursing Service, through support for Healthy Eating and through a rich out-of-hours programme with an important input from our SSCO.

Students will have a voice in this through the Year and Academy Councils and the Governors' Student Progress & Achievement Committee which will monitor the implementation of this policy.
