English	<p>Language: Revise from the RED book, Revise the PAF (purpose, audience and format) of each writing type. Practise posing and planning responses (annotate your response using the taught key when done). Complete VSSSP revision and checks – it accounts for a portion of the marks.</p> <p>Literature: Revision from the PURPLE book. Revise the three characters you have been directed to (gather key quotes / know key hooks) Revise the context of your play. Use spot-comment-zoom to respond. Revise past papers/exemplar answers from your books.</p>
Maths	<p>Foundation tier: Place value, estimating techniques and using a calculator. Written calculations, order of operations Sets and probability, angles in polygons, solving equations, ratio and proportion: value for money</p> <p>Higher tier: Calculations with fractions, Expanding brackets, using formulae, Percentage change, Arcs and sectors, Probability: Dependent and independent events, Angles in polygons</p>
Science	<p>Chemistry - Elements, mixtures & compounds, separation techniques, chromatography.</p> <p>Physics - Particle Theory, conduction and IR radiation.</p> <p>Biology – Pathogens, The 7 Diseases, Antibiotics and Painkillers, Body defences (including white blood cells).</p>
Geography	UK Physical landscape; Coastal landscapes and Urban Issues & Challenges.
History	Revise everything studied so far this year on the causes of the First World War and the Trenches. Use your books and knowledge organisers.
French	Life on line / opinions / describing a famous person / discussing future plans and describing a past event such as a birthday and music preferences / concerts.
Spanish	All about me (including likes / dislikes / film TV preferences and describing a past tense event such as a birthday and talking about a famous person and their likes dislikes).
PE	Nutrition, energy use, somatotypes, lifestyle factors, components of fitness, fitness testing
RS	The Problem of Evil and Suffering. You will need to know; the 2 types of evil, God's characteristics, and the religious responses to why suffering exists.
